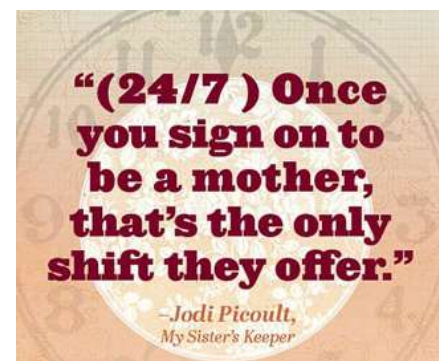

Young Sheldon

I enjoy watching a television show called ‘Young Sheldon’. It is a quirky series about a 9-year-old child genius (Sheldon) growing up in Texas. Sheldon doesn’t believe in God, but his mother is very religious.

In this week’s episode, a child in their community dies and Sheldon’s mother questions her own deep faith. She asks herself how there can be a God when things like this happen. She stops saying prayers before meals and is generally troubled by the events in her community.

Sheldon notices straight away that things are different and asks her why she has stopped praying and if she has stopped believing in God. She replies that she is trying to have some quiet time to reflect on who God is and how he could allow such a tragedy to occur. This is a time when she is obviously questioning her faith.

Sheldon listens to her with obvious anxiety and tries to rationalise why she is feeling the way she is. Finally, he declares there must be a ‘supreme being’ as she, in all the billions of people in the world, is the perfect mother for him, and that can’t be an accident! With that, his mother wraps her arms around him and appears to have her faith restored, at least temporarily.

Sometimes in life we can question our faith. It should cause us to reflect deeply, which isn’t a bad thing. Then hopefully we have someone in our lives that can speak to us honestly and lead us back to God.

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
