Plebiscite

I have been pondering writing something on the current plebiscite on gay marriage for some time. The question for us all to consider seems relatively simple at first sight. Then why has it caused me so much trouble? I have prayed to God for insight and read numerous articles from both sides of the argument.

I was pleased to see the way in which Archbishop Costelloe eloquently put the no case on behalf of the Church (in WA at least). I thought the carefully chosen words were beautifully crafted. If you haven't read the letter, I urge you to do so.

I have also read some useful articles written by Jesuit Priest, Father Frank Brennan, who argues in favour of a yes vote. He makes some very good points worthy of consideration. His comments and views can easily be accessed on the internet, as can many other Catholic theologians.

I am not going to argue either way on this topic, as it is one where I believe we need to personally consider all aspects and decide for ourselves. I do think it is important to complete the paperwork and return your form. In this way, the politicians of the day can be informed of the will of the majority of the people.

The problem in these matters seems to occur when politics becomes the driving force for either side of the debate.
