PLENARY COUNCIL 2020 PARISH UPDATE- LISTEN TO WHAT THE SPIRIT IS SAYING. Pope Francis has approved the Australian Bishops' decision to hold a Plenary Council in Australia in 2020 and 2021. It is a significant moment for the Church in Australia to make decisions about the future. Archbishop Costelloe has been appointed as President of the Plenary Council by Pope Francis and as Chairman of the Bishops' Commission on the Plenary.

At the end of July, National Plenary Council Facilitator, Ms Lana Turvey-Collins, will be in Perth to conduct training sessions for parish representatives. Two parish representatives: Mrs Leila Coffey and Ms Tina Tomeo will attend the training session on Friday 27th July at Newman Siena Centre. This will enable the representatives to obtain the information and process for the involvement of our parish community in the Plenary Council at the local level.
