Mental Health Week

This week is mental health week. The issue of mental health is spoken about more openly these days. However, there is still a stigma around mental health. It is as important, or more important, than keeping your physical health. I would argue that both are inextricably linked.

I think it is important, as a faith community, to be as inclusive as possible. We can support each other in times of tribulation. I also believe that having a common bond (in faith) should draw us all together more closely. Having someone and something to believe in is good for your mental health.

Reading some of the shocking statistics on the suicide rate in Australia is quite sobering. Many these suicides could probably be attributed to mental ill health. So, I think it is an absolute Christian obligation to reach out to those in our society that are shunned and try to make them feel welcomed. We may never know the impact that we can have on another.

I would ask that we try and be more non-judgemental and accept others as God intended us to. Let's try and look after each other. We may find we have more in common with others that we could possibly imagine.
